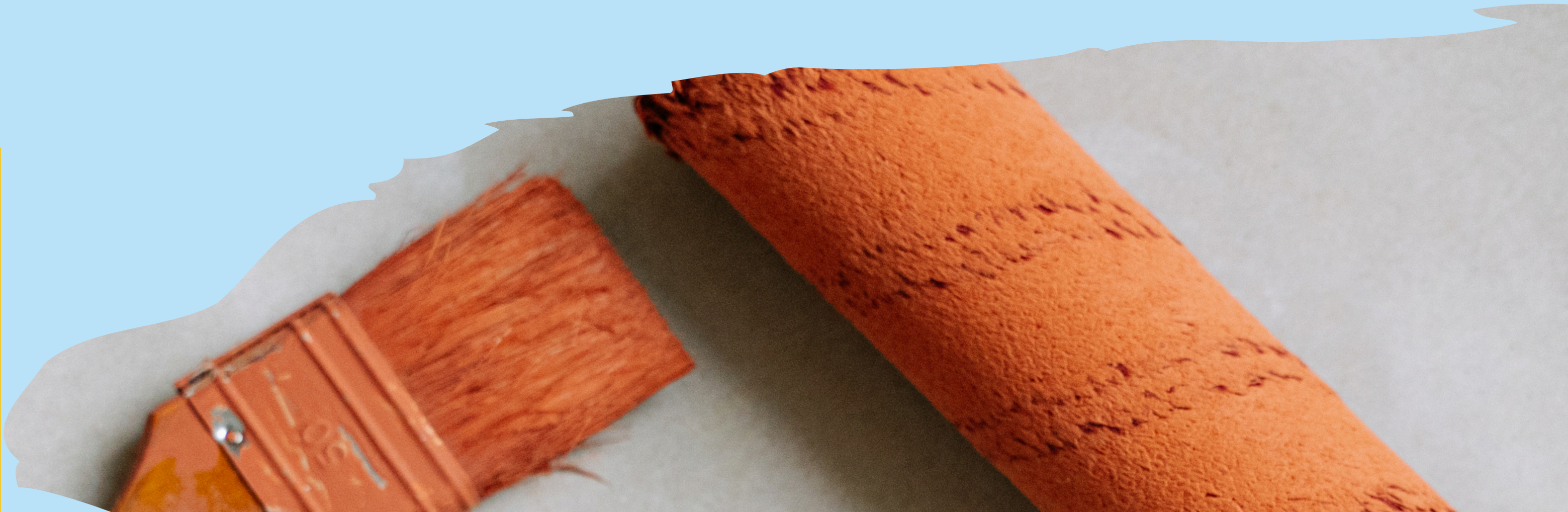

Types of Wall Paint Finishes

- | | | | |
|---|------------|---|--|
| ✓ | Matte | : | Non-reflective finish; ideal for concealing wall imperfections. |
| ✓ | Eggshell | : | Soft sheen; suitable for living areas with moderate traffic. |
| ✓ | Satin | : | Smooth finish; easy to clean, perfect for kitchens and bathrooms. |
| ✓ | Semi-Gloss | : | Noticeable shine; great for trim and cabinets due to durability. |
| ✓ | Gloss | : | High shine; best for high-traffic areas requiring frequent cleaning. |
| ✓ | High-Gloss | : | Ultra-shiny; provides a hard-wearing surface for furniture. |

Different Types Of House Paint Jobs



- ✓ Interior Painting : Enhances walls, ceilings, trims, and doors within your home.
- ✓ Exterior Painting : Protects and beautifies the outer walls, fences, decks and siding.
- ✓ Roof Painting : Adds a protective layer to roofs, improving energy efficiency & lifespan.
- ✓ Commercial : Focuses on painting offices, warehouses, and retail space.
- ✓ Special Painting : Includes decorative finishes, textured coatings, and feature walls.

Preparing The Surface For Cleaning

| ✓ Clean | : | Remove dirt and grime to ensure paint adhesion |
| ✓ Sand | : | Smooth rough spots for an even finish. |
| ✓ Repair | : | Fill cracks and holes with spackle for a uniform surface. |
| ✓ Prime | : | Apply primer to enhance paint adherence and longevity. |
| ✓ Mask | : | Use painter's tape to protect edges and fixtures. |
| ✓ Remove Hardware | : | Detach fixtures to facilitate a seamless paint job. |
| ✓ Protect Floors | : | Lay down drop cloths to catch spills. |

Signs Your Surface Needs Painting

| ✓ Fading | : | Colors appear dull or washed out. |
| ✓ Peeling | : | Paint is lifting or flaking off the surface. |
| ✓ Cracking | : | Visible lines or splits in the paint layer. |
| ✓ Stains | : | Persistent marks or discolouration. |
| ✓ Mould | : | Presence of mildew or fungal growth. |
| ✓ Bubbles | : | Blisters indicating poor adhesion or moisture issues. |
| ✓ Moisture | : | Damp spots suggest leaks or high humidity. |

Signs of Poor-Quality Paint



- ✓ **Strong, Rancid Smell** : It must also be added that a repulsive smell is a sign of low quality.
- ✓ **Lumpy Consistency** : Lumpy consistency suggesting surface wear.
- ✓ **Visible Mould** : Stains are a sign of mould which is spoilage.
- ✓ **Dried Out** : Dried-out paint becoming thick and unusable.
- ✓ **Rust in the Tin** : It changes colours to reveal moisture exposure.
- ✓ **Grains in the Paint** : Grains in paint affecting texture.
- ✓ **Separated Solvent** : Separated solvent showing improper blending
